What is a cookie?

A "cookie" is a small text file that is downloaded onto your computer or mobile device when you access a website. When you visit our Website and agree to have cookies set on your computer or mobile device, basic information is passively collected through your web browser via such cookies or similar tracking technologies. We explain why we use cookies further below.

Websites can use different types of cookies including 'first-' and 'third-' party cookies and session or persistent cookies. We briefly explain those different types of cookies below:

- **First-party cookies** are cookies set by the website visited by a user (i.e., the website displayed at the top of the browser).
- **Third-party cookies** are cookies that are set by a domain other than the one being visited by a user. If you visit a website but another company sets a cookie through that website, it would be a third-party cookie.
- **Session cookies** allow websites to link a user's actions during their browser session. Session cookies are temporary and remain on your device until you leave the website you are currently visiting.
- **Persistent cookies**, unlike session cookies, remain on a user's device in between browser sessions and remember the user's actions and preferences on a website or even potentially across different websites. Persistent cookies may be used to remember your preferences.

What types of cookies do we use?

We use first-party cookies and third-party cookies on our Website. The first-party cookies are persistent cookies and used for legal purposes. The third-party cookies are both session and persistent cookies and are set by our third-party service providers. For example, we use Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google, Inc. ("Google") and embedded content from Vimeo.com, Inc ("Vimeo"). Google and Vimeo use cookies to help us analyze how you use the Website and enhance your experience when you visit the Website. Both collect and track your viewing behavior in accordance with their own privacy policies, over which we have no control.
